

Investment Policy


The fund is managed with an indexed method and is distinguished by broad diversification, low tracking errors, and low-cost management. The investment objective is to replicate the reference index as closely as possible and to minimize performance deviations from the benchmark. The MSCI Japan ESG Leaders Index is a capitalization weighted index that provides exposure to companies with high Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) performance relative to their sector peers. MSCI Japan ESG Leaders Index consists of large and mid cap companies in Japanese markets.

ESG Approach

UBS Asset Management categorizes this sub-fund as a Sustainability Focus Fund that promotes environmental and social characteristics. As index tracking fund, the ESG characteristics of the fund and its ESG integration approaches are derived from the ESG index that the fund is tracking.

The fund follows the exclusion recommendations of the Swiss Association for Responsible Investments (www.svvk-asir.ch). The recommendations affect issuers whose conduct or products violate the normative criteria of SVVK-ASIR, e.g. violations of international conventions or production of controversial weapons. This is a general approach and not specific to the ESG strategy of the fund.

Accumulating	Indicates a regular reinvestment of the dividends received in the portfolio itself
Annualized risk	Annualized risk is a statistic, which is used to measure the risk of a fund by describing the range of returns, which were achieved in the observation period are most likely to be achieved. Greater volatility implies greater risk.
Annualized return	A measure of how much an investment has increased on average each year during a specific period.
Beta	A measure of the volatility, or systematic risk, of a single security or fund in comparison to the market as a whole.
Carbon emission intensity	The weighted average emissions intensity, which is provided by MSCI ESG, divides the Scopes 1 & 2 emissions in tons of CO2-equivalent by million \$ sales. Intensities are broken down by GICS sector and are security weighted.
Distribution policy	Indicates whether the fund distributes or reinvests the dividends received from underlying securities (Accumulating)
ESG index	A ticked 'ESG index' box reflects that the ESG fund targets a replication of an ESG index and the reference benchmark is used for the purpose of attaining the environmental and/or social characteristics promoted. In case the box is not ticked, the fund replicates a non-ESG index.
ESG Controversy Flag	ESG Controversy Flag is designed to provide timely and consistent assessments of ESG controversies involving publicly traded companies and fixed income issuers. A controversy case is typically a one-off event such as an environmental oil spill, an accident, or allegations such as safety issues in a production facility. Controversy flags can be red, orange, yellow or green. Red indicates that a company is involved in one or more very severe controversies. Company ESG Ratings are calculated on an industry relative basis while the underlying individual E, S and G Ratings are absolute. Hence, the ESG Rating cannot be seen as an average of the individual E, S and G Ratings. Government ESG Ratings identify a country's exposure to and management of ESG risk factors and explain how these factors might impact the long-term sustainability of its economy.
